Dear Colleague,

I have now had the opportunity to meet with all the Members of the Committee; with those Members who are Central Bank Governors on 12 July, and with the other Members on 27 July. I also met with the two Rapporteurs on 18 July.

I propose that the first full meeting of the Committee should be held in Basle on the afternoon of 13 September at 2.00 p.m. The meeting will last until about 6.00 p.m.

As a basis for the initial discussion I will circulate at the beginning of September a paper which will examine the relevance for our work of the Werner Report and of its implementation in the light of current developments.

I attach a schedule of the future meetings of the Committee. As you will see, most of them will be held in Basle to take advantage of the presence there of most of the Members. There will also be two additional meetings. In October, when the Governors do not meet in Basle, I propose that we meet in Luxembourg; and the final meeting of the Committee would be held in Brussels. Each of these meetings would be for the full day.
