Reason for change and expected benefits/business motivation:

With the go live of T2S TARGET2 liquidity is not only held inside T2 anymore but also on the dedicated cash accounts (DCAs) in T2S. From an accounting perspective both systems are connected via two Dedicated Transit Accounts, the T2S transit account in T2 and the RTGS (T2) transit account in T2S, both opened in the books of the ECB. As the two systems will operate independently from each other a permanent consistency between both accounts has to be ensured.

T2S Outbound Liquidity Transfers allow moving cash from the T2S Dedicated Cash Account of a participant (DCA in T2S) to an RTGS account (RTGSA in RTGS). This transfer is based on the execution of two "legs":

- A "T2S leg", debiting the participants DCA and crediting the RTGS Transit Account in T2S of the corresponding currency.
- An "RTGS leg", debiting the T2S transit account in RTGS and crediting the RTGSA.

In exceptional conditions, it could happen that the "RTGS leg" of the transfer cannot be executed, while the "T2S leg" was successfully executed. It is foreseen that such situation is managed manually, involving contacts between operating teams of T2S and of the respective RTGS to secure the resolution process.

In case the completion of the "RTGS leg" cannot be reached, the DCA debited by the "T2S leg" must be refunded.

However, a business rule in T2S only authorizes the execution of internal liquidity transfers between DCAs linked to the same RTGS account or belonging to the same payment bank. A side effect of this rule is that no internal liquidity transfer is possible between a Dedicated Transit Account (belonging to ECB and linked to T2S transit account within the RTGS) and a T2S DCA of a participant.

As a consequence, in the aforementioned exceptional conditions, the refunding of the DCA cannot be performed by debiting the RTGS Dedicated Transit Account, which can lead to accounting issues due to uneven balances between RTGS and T2S Transit Accounts.

The business rule therefore needs to be modified in a way to exclude RTGS Transit Accounts from the restriction and to allow therefore internal liquidity transfers involving these accounts.

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Description of requested change:

The business rule LLC1008 has to be modified in order to authorize LTs from a Dedicated Transit Account (to be triggered by the ECB as owner of the account) to the DCA of a participant.

Currently the business rule LLC1008 is foreseen for DCA within the internal specification but does not explicitly exclude Dedicated Transit Accounts. Therefore the business rule should be adjusted and extended that this business rule is not applicable in case one of the involved accounts is a Dedicated Transit Account. This is necessary to allow rebooking e. g. in case of restart after disaster.

High level description of Impact:

Outcome/Decisions:

- * CRG meeting of 28 April 2015: The CRG recommended the approval of the Change Request.
